

Industrial Action by the National Education Union – Thursday 2nd March 2023

Nearly every teacher at Hitherfield will be taking industrial action on Thursday 2nd March 2023 and therefore the school will be <u>closed to ALL pupils</u> on that day.

Whilst the school will be open to non-striking staff, they are not permitted to undertake duties that they would normally not do, such as covering for colleagues who are on strike. It is therefore not possible to provide a safe environment for any children on that day.

If your child usually attends the Breakfast and/or After School Club that day you will not be charged as the service will not be operating.

If your child usually attends an extra-curricular club, such as football, Martial Arts, Drumming or STEM, they will not be operating and we will either run an additional session or refund you for that session.

The other proposed dates of strike action that will impact Hitherfield and other London schools if they go ahead are:

- Wednesday 15th March 2023
- Thursday 16th March 2023

Parents/Carers of children entitled to free school meals will receive a voucher equivalent to the amount of money the school receives for the meal that they are not receiving, which is £2.40. As this is the second day the school has had to close the voucher issued will be for £4.80 per child.



On Monday the 27th February a judge from The London Children's flower Society will be coming to Hitherfield to judge our entries to this year's spring bulb competition.

The Carlton Daffodils, Tete-a-Tete Daffodils and Hyacinths that you have grown from bulbs sent home in November, or that were planted at school with Jess and taken home in pots in January, will all be judged, so please bring them in to school on the morning of the 27th.

Following our visitor's judgement, bronze, silver or gold level certificates will be issued to all entries presented regardless of if your child's plant has flowered yet or not.

For any bulbs that came into flower early, photographic evidence, if you have it, can be given alongside the already bloomed plant. Photos can be brought in with the plant, or alternatively emailed to admin@hitherfield.co.uk under the subject title 'spring bulb competition' followed by your child's name and class.

All plant pots can then be collected to be taken home at the end of the day.

Fire Safety Workshops

This week years two and five had a visit from the London Fire Brigade. They learnt about various ways to prevent fires in the home and what to do in an emergency.

Free Home Fire Safety Visits

A fire can start in any room and the effects can be devastating, even a small fire in your home can lead to substantial damage and expensive repairs. The LFB wants to stop fires from happening and that is why we offer free home fire safety visits to help keep you and your loved ones safe.

What happens during a home fire safety visit?

Our firefighters or trained staff will visit you at home, at a time that suits you and carry out a risk assessment. They will give you advice based on your home and individual needs, this includes; information on how to **prevent** fires, the importance of smoke alarms to **detect** a fire and your **escape** plan in the event of a fire.

A visit can take up to 90 minutes or longer if needed and we will fit free smoke alarms if required.

Specialist alarms can be fitted for people who may have a delayed response to escape for example; strobe light and vibrating pad alarms for those who are deaf or hard of hearing.





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To celebrate the food of North Africa and Arabia we are suggesting a delicious tagine with Moroccan spices made with meat or plant-based alternative protein such as Quorn Pieces and chickpeas, served with rainbow vegetable couscous, roasted peppers, squash, carrots, maybe courgettes. Just remember to keep the veg chunky.

Method

Here's our recommended recipe, or you can simply adapt your own recipe – just keep the veg chunky and serve with a reminder to the children to Eat Them to Defeat Them and get them to say "Bring it on veggies!"

- Place a suitable pan on the stove to heat and add the oil and red onion until it starts to soften.
- Add the chicken and cook until it starts to colour and is cooked through. If using Quorn Pieces or Quorn Vegan Beef Pieces, add to the pan at point 4.
- Probe and record temperature must be above 75 °C.
- Add the red pepper, courgette, butternut squash, carrots, and chickpeas. Continue to cook until the vegetables begin to colour and soften, then add the cumin, paprika, cinnamon, turmeric, vegetable bouillon, peas, sweetcorn, couscous and water (and Quorn Pieces or Quorn Vegan Beef Pieces, if using).
- Bring the pan back to the boil, stirring the ingredients together then remove from the heat.
- Probe and record temperature must be above 75 °C
- Add the diced butter to the top of the couscous and cover with cling film to secure in the steam.
- Allow the pan to stand for 10 minutes in a hot cupboard, to allow the residual heat of the pan to cook the couscous.
- Remove the cling film and add the chopped chives, using a fork gently fluff up the couscous to separate the grains and serve immediately.

Ingredients

Couscous

15ml oil

1 red onion, diced

300g chicken diced or Quorn Pieces or Quorn Vegan Beef Pieces

1/2 red pepper, diced

100g courgette, diced

100g butternut squash, diced

100g carrots, diced

300g chickpeas

2 tsp cumin powder

2 tsp paprika

1 tsp cinnamon

1-2 tsp turmeric

15g vegetable bouillon

100g peas

100g sweetcorn

350g couscous

440ml water

100g butter or plant-based alternative, diced

10g chives, chopped

Serving suggestions

You can serve any kind of wet dish with North African or Arabian feel (or if necessary, any dish you can serve with couscous).
