Can you be a reading Hitherfield Hero?

Last year we had incredible success with our Hitherfield Hero reading programme, ensuring every class in the school had a volunteer reader from the community at least once a week! This had an incredible impact on our readers and we want to do that again this year!

We are calling on anyone who is able to donate at least 30 minutes a week of their time to the school (either 9-9.30am or 3-3.30pm) to help target children learn to read.

In each class, from Reception to Year 6, there are children who need YOUR help to maximise their progress.

You would be assigned a class, and listen to three children read once a week on a day to suit you. This one-to-one reading has an incredible impact- just five minutes reading a day can make a huge difference to fluency!

Sadly, with the cuts to education funding, the school has less and less staff in order to achieve this targeted, often one-on-one, support. This is why we need **YOU!**

Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due. The NHS Immunisation Team will be visiting Hitherfield on Friday 3rd November.

Please complete the consent form even if you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu this year. Completion of the consent form is not mandatory if you do not want your child to be vaccinated. However, as providers of the school age vaccinations, NHSE requires that we provide numbers of parents that do not consent to their child being vaccinated. Therefore, we will only use this information to provide numbers of parents declining consent, no other details will be shared. If consent forms are not completed, you may be contacted by phone or text. If you have returned a no consent, we will not make any further contact this year.
