We're going to be taking a look at our fundraisers over the past year and what we believe are some fantastic achievements, but I'd like to start first with saying a huge thanks to this year's committee. We thank you so much for all of your support in making our events and fundraisers so successful. Thanks also to Ria who spent 6 months on our committee before outside commitments meant she had to step down. After 2 years on the committee Helen has decided it's time to stand down and we'd like to say thank you for all of her time and support but in particular her amazing efforts on the raffles at our Summer and Christmas fairs! The other person who will be standing down after a lengthy 3 years on the committee is our Chair of the last 2 years, Keela - a massive thanks to her for the huge amount of time and effort she's put in over the last 2 years and the brilliant job she's done getting us back onto a full non-Covid schedule with the many fantastic events that have been run. We'd like to take a quick look at our events and fundraisers over the last year starting with the International Food Festival in October, an event which hadn't been run for some time and thanks to some amazing contributions from Paola and Frank, Rachel Dobson, Azy and many others was a lovely after school event - a total sell-out. We used this event to trial a voucher system as oppose to cash and cards which had its positives, but after feedback we decided to go back to the old system for future events to offer more flexibility for our families. We've decided not to run the festival in October this year as it's already a busy term but will keep it in mind for a later point in the year or next year.

Moving on to the festive season Keela and Paola smoothly managed the always popular Christmas Cards. We worked again with Mistletoe & amp; Pine Christmas Trees, and offered more flexibility with collection dates which proved to be popular so we sold more than ever before. Jade Koch put together another offering of wine to purchase for Christmas which again sold well so many thanks to Jade for her time and support. Warm Up Fridays were hugely welcomed once again, helping us through the November and December months with Hot Chocolates and an always devoured mountain of doughnuts! This year's Christmas Fair was very cold but still brilliantly festive and well-attended. A Hitherfield pupil's Grandad saved Santa's Grotto at the last minute after Covid hit the North Pole! The BBQ goodies flew off the grill and our new cheese toastie stall went down well too. And despite the chilly temperatures our kids and amazing volunteers stuck it out in style with all the usual favourite games and funfair rides and we raised over £4000. Clare Butler and myself ran the annual Quiz night in March, as always very kindly hosted by the brilliant Alex and Emma, and this year's was another great evening helped by the excellent addition of Paola's very popular veggie curry! Many thanks to Clare, Paola, Mary and all involved for their time and support.

Azy's final Eid Fair (at least as a Hitherfield parent!) was held in April this year, so that it was closer to Eid, and Azy finished with a bang describing it as the best ever and raising an incredible £3342, split equally between the PTA and the Syria and Turkey Earthquake appeal.



Ice Cream Fridays returned, still much loved though somewhat dampened by a bit of a soggy summer! This year we were helped by the purchase of a big chest freezer in the staff room and ran ICF from the main playground to make it easier for those running it on the day. We had a lovely team of regular volunteers so huge thanks to them for all of their help. In June Jolene Butler and Meryl O'Rourke ran our first ever in-person Comedy and Curry Night with some outstanding comedic talents and another brilliant curry and rice from Paola, assisted by Azy. We were super lucky to be holding it on a beautiful sunny evening so everyone could enjoy food and drinks on the plaza before the Comedians started their sets. The event received brilliant feedback and made almost £1000 so massive thanks to Jolene, Meryl, Paola, Azy, the brilliant Comedians and all involved. Also in June we held a very full summer fair, adding a couple of new games and an extra bouncy castle. We were super lucky to be holding it on another rare hot day so got as much as we could under the shade of the trim trail, which proved to be a great spot for our lovely Facepainting team and many of our games and the Tombola. Paola brilliantly found a new estate agent (Oaks) to sponsor the Summer Fair and over £5000 was raised in total. Throughout the year Paola has also worked her magic with many a uniform sale, which are hugely important in keeping the cost of uniform down for all of our Hitherfield families and being one of the most important ways in which we can improve in our efforts to take a more eco-friendly and sustainable approach as a school and an organisation. We'd very much like to look at how we could make uniform sales easier to run so this can be done more often.

We're very excited to welcome in some new members to the 23/24 PTA committee. The committee is of course absolutely essential for organising and running our fundraisers but it's also very important that we have a range of opinions and ideas contributing to the decisions made by the PTA. However, as the PTA committee is now generally smaller than in the past, and more of its members are working parents it has also been hugely helpful to have 2 significant events in the guiz and comedy night brilliantly organised in the main by non-PTA people. Going forward we'd love to be able to support parents and carers not on the committee in organising and running fundraisers as a project so that they can be more flexibly involved in the PTA. Lucia will talk more about our what we've been able to fund this year but these include reading books, handwriting books, the Christmas Panto, the Y5 Shakespeare performance, Y1 outdoor play equipment and canopy, PE equipment and Trim Trail equipment. With facebook a little less popular than it used to be, this year we set up a PTA messages whatsapp group with a rep from each class sending on messages to their individual classes which has been incredibly helpful for promoting our events and recruiting volunteers. Many thanks to our brilliant reps! Massive thanks to Chris and the Hitherfield Team for their continued and complete support. The Office and Premises staff are always lovely and available to help with all of our last minute requests, making our job so much easier. A huge thank you also to the Hitherfield families and local businesses for all of the generous prize donations to our 2 raffles. The funds raised from the raffles are a very significant part of the total raised by our fairs. We are, as always, so grateful to the Hitherfield community for their support - volunteering, coming to our events and coping so well with our constant marketing - thank you all!

Uniform Donations



Parents/Carers may like to be reminded that the Streatham Wells Low Traffic Neighbourhood trial starts on Monday 23 October.

The trial aims to reduce motor traffic on streets around Streatham Wells, including Valley Road and Culverhouse Gardens. It is designed to make the neighbourhood safer, healthier and more climate resilient. As well as reducing through traffic, it is designed to improve walking, wheeling and cycling conditions for children travelling to school. It is also hoped the trial will lead to a reduction in the motor traffic on Leigham Vale outside the school's main entrance.

Evelina London is providing free local HENRY sessions for Lambeth & Southwark families with children under 5.


