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Little Wandle Reading Practice Sessions

We are very excited to announce that next week Year One will be starting our new Reading Practise Sessions!

Reading practice sessions are:

- timetabled three times a week.
- taught by specially trained members of staff.
 - taught in small groups.
- designed to improve children's fluency in reading.

Your child will read the same book over the course of the three sessions, with each session focussing on a different element of reading; decoding, prosody and comprehension.

The decodable home reading texts that your child will bring home each week will be the text that they have shared and read in class as their group text, so please do not be alarmed that the book is familiar to your child. This is intentional as research shows that children enjoy re-reading texts, it helps to build their fluency levels and improves their pace when reading as well as their confidence. They will bring this book home after their last reading session of the week. Children will also bring home an additional decodable reading practice book at their level, which they will not have read before.

Book return day will be WEDNESDAY for all year one classes.

The school has spent a huge amount of money and time investing in these Reading Sessions, and the books are the key element, with all children relying on the same books. This means that it is **ESSENTIAL** that the books are returned every Wednesday so the sessions can run. The school does not have the money to replace lost books, and all children rely on them to learn to read, so we all need to play our part here!

If a book is lost or not returned, or is returned damaged, you will be issued with an invoice for £5.75 to cover the cost of the book, or sent an Amazon link so you are able to order the book directly for the school.

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Calling all edible gardening enthusiasts!

...Or even those who are mildly interested or curious. For the spring term we've extended our Thursday morning edible gardening parent sessions to be 9-10am (back to 9-9:30 in the Summer term).

Jessi is eager to introduce you to the food that the kids grow in the edible garden and around the school. You might find yourself getting involved in pruning, hole composting, recognising which weeds are edible, sawing old branches to make borders, experimenting with edible flowers, getting involved in repurposing, finding new food plants to grow, grabbing cuttings for your own garden, picking up ideas or influencing what we grow here.

If you're waiting with a nursery child till 9:15am after the 8:55am drop off feel free to bring them with you, or you can join after you've dropped them off too. Do as much of the session and as many of them as you like.
