Pupils at Hitherfield have once again been awarded a coveted Eco-Schools Green Flag.

The Eco-Schools Green Flag is an international accreditation that recognises efforts to raise environmental awareness amongst young people, whilst taking action to make their school more sustainable. Hitherfield has now regained its status as an accredited Eco-School, following their achievement a few years ago. This award perfectly sits in line with our RHS Gardening School and our London Food Growing Schools awards.

The Eco-Schools programme was established in 1994 and is now delivered in more than 70 countries across the globe. The programme prompts young people to explore a variety of environmental issues, including climate change, pollution, and biodiversity loss. Pupils are then empowered to plan and deliver environmental actions in their school, local community, and beyond.

Since we began working towards an Eco-Schools Green Flag during 2023, achievements have included developing a compost area for our fruit waste, working with a company called RAFT (RetroFit Action For Tomorrow) to get a better understand of our carbon footprint, installing an air source heat pump and solar panels to move away from our dependence on gas and taking part in an energy saving awareness week. The work that we do about the environment within our curriculum was also commended when the award was achieved.

And this year, pupils at Hitherfield will be building on these strong foundations, collaborating with the eco-council to work on three Eco-Schools topics: waste, energy and biodiversity. We will keep you posted with any developments.

Eco-Schools England Manager, Adam Flint, said: "The Eco-Schools Green Flag award is an internationally recognised symbol of high environmental standards. The pupils and school staff that earn the award deserve immense credit for their hard work, determination, and creativity. Their passion for protecting our planet is an inspiration to us all."

At Parents' Evening your class teacher will inform you of your child's percentage. What does it all mean and why is school attendance so important?

Being in school is important to your child's academic achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Research found that pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and <u>secondary school</u> missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well. Schools can facilitate positive peer relationships, which contributes to better mental health and wellbeing.

Government legislation states that parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure that their children of compulsory school age receive a suitable full time education. It is also vital that they ensure their child's regular and punctual attendance at school and that the school itself monitors absence, with a view to improving a child's attendance percentage if required.

With support from Lambeth, we are working hard on strategies to improve both attendance and punctuality. Attendance levels below are colour coded and indicate the level of concern.

Green 97% and above - Hitherfield attendance target is met, well done.

Amber 90 - 96.9% - In need of improvement.

Red 89.9% or below - Concern

If your child's attendance percentage places your child into the GREEN category, this means that we have no concerns regarding attendance at the current point in time. We would like to express our congratulations and look forward to a continuation of good attendance.

If your child's attendance percentage places your child into the AMBER category, this means that we have some concern over the current level of attendance. Attendance will be monitored over the next term in the hope that an improvement can be achieved.

If your child's attendance percentage places your child into the RED category, we are concerned with the level of attendance.

Pupils in this category are absent from school at least half a day a week. For some this will be an issue we are aware of and other agencies may already be involved. In these cases we will continue to work with you to address concerns and secure an improvement in attendance.

Where we have concerns, parents or carers will be invited to an attendance panel and the Education Welfare Service may also attend.

Please note that any request for leave of absence, not including sickness, from pupils in this category will not be authorised by the school.

Support is available if you are experiencing any difficulties causing your child to be absent. We believe education is a partnership between the school, the child and their family and are committed to working together with families to ensure that no child is disadvantaged by poor attendance. 


