I have been writing to you with updates termly since I announced this programme in 2023. Now that we near the end of the second year of UFSM, there will be fewer updates to provide you with, so I will only write to you if and when there is new information to share. Working together, we can build a London that is healthier, fairer and more prosperous for everyone.
