Both goals were scored by Grayson Bogdanov with 2 fantastic strikes but we allowed Rosendale back into the game through not clearing the ball when we could have, more than once for both goals. Rosendale then took the lead before half time but we were still in the game.

Another good goal early in the second half by Grayson levelled the score again. But again Rosendale were relentless constantly piling on pressure and the boys could not hold on conceding another 2 goals before the end of the game with the final score being 5 - 2 to Rosendale.

The boys should be proud of their performance but hopefully they will look at how Rosendale play and knuckle down and work harder at training. Well done boys!"

Each programme will provide:

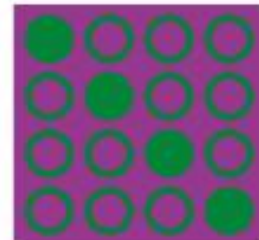
- Free, healthy, and tasty food
