A really big thank you to all our parents and children who have been sticking to this term's start and end times. We appreciate that many of you have to wait between the different drop off and collection times. Therefore, between now and the half term, we will make steady changes to reduce the overall waiting times.

Next week we are making changes to the times children arrive and leave from the Leigham Vale entrance to reduce the overall times at that entrance from 55 minutes to 30 minutes (40 minutes at the end of the school day). We are writing to advise you of the various ensembles we have to offer at the Brixton Hill Music Centre situated at the Clapham Park Centre on Kingswood Road, Brixton Hill. We have worked hard over the summer to ensure we are compliant with all the most up to date advice concerning COVID-19 and are thrilled to be opening our doors to face to face tuition week beginning Monday 28_{th} October and are looking for new recruits for all of our major ensembles.

Our new look Brixton Hill Music Centre experience comprises 3 stages of learning:

Stage 1: Musitrax

Entry-level musicianship courses, each lasting a year:

- Musitrax Sing (Reception: 5 years old),
- Musitrax Tune (Year 1: 6 years old)
- Musitrax Play (Year 2: 7 years old).

When a student completes a year of Musitrax they automatically progress to the next group. **MX Sing** students move to **MX Tune**, **MX Tune** students move to **MX Play** and **MX Play** students will be asked to choose a pathway within **Stage 2**.

Stage 2: Pathfinders

Children aged 8 (Year 3) and above are given the opportunity to choose and explore a family of instruments for a year by joining one of our 'pathways' (large-group lessons for beginners)

- The Brass Pathway includes trumpets and trombones.
- Woodwind Pathway includes flutes and clarinets,
- Strings Pathway involves violins and cellos.
- Percussion Pathway includes drums and tuned percussion.
- The Vocal, Guitar and Keyboard Pathways focus on the instrument described.

During the first phase of the course, students will explore instruments belonging to their chosen pathway. They then go on to secure key technical skills on a single instrument. When a student has finished their year as a **Pathfinder** they will automatically move on to **Stage 3**.

Stage 3: Lessons and Ensembles

For the richest experience, we recommend young people continue their learning by combining tuition (lessons) with one or more group music-making activities (ensembles) from the vast array of options available. Progression from junior to senior ensembles is guided by tutors. Students have the option to join Stage 3 lessons at any point of their learning if they are age 7 or upwards.

Theory, Capoeira and SEN/D provision

Pupils can engage with Theory and Capoeira classes at any point in their learning journey. We are also able to offer bespoke music lessons for pupils with SEN/D. Bursary awards are available for all courses
