Collection from After School Clubs

The school has responded to feedback from parents and carers by providing staggered collection times for the Breakfast and Afterschool Club (BASC).

The school has shown flexibility in arranging these times and we rely on parents and carers to adhere to them in order to limit the spread of the virus. We would also like to point out that staff members escorting children for collection without prior notice or agreement affects the child/ adult ratio which in turn then becomes a safeguarding issue. Furthermore, the activities that are provided to the children may be disrupted too.

Unless there are extenuating circumstances, the school will not be able to accommodate collection of children other than the times advertised which are 4.45, 5.15 and 5.50.

We would also like to encourage parents and carers to be punctual when dropping children off in the mornings as a late drop off has a knock on effect for children using the Breakfast Club service. We can only commence this service when all the children are collected and brought to the relevant rooms by staff members.
