This week we continued our celebrations of Black History with a particular focus on the contributions made by notable men and women throughout history.

For English, we had Mr Champion (Head of English) teach an exciting and engaging lesson this week for our Year 10 students on the topic of Tone. Using press coverage from the day of windrush, original 1948 BBC transcripts and cinematic footage (from the then released film Empire Windrush), Mr Champion taught students how to read and assess different types of texts. The lesson objective was to be able to show understanding that tone could be used to change the meaning of a text
