Hitherfield's Got Talent is going virtual!

This year, we are attempting our annual Hitherfield's Got Talent event in the virtual world! The performing space will be in homes, gardens or any open space the children wish to film their act. It is very important that children performing follow the social distancing guidelines. This means that they will only be able to perform on their own or, for the first time ever, with other members of their family! All children from Years 1 - 6may take part in auditioning to represent their class in the HGT Final.

Please read the arrangements below so that you know how we are going to make this event happen!
Children who want to take part must ask a family member to film their act, making sure that the film is no longer than two minutes. The films will need to be uploaded to their Year Group blog by 3:30pm on Monday 22nd of February. That's the day we return from the half term break.

- Please be aware that music choices need to have appropriate and respectful content. We will need the help of all you parents/carers out there to make sure that any music choices are appropriate. If they are not, the film will not be approved for the blog, the act will not be seen and your child will be very disappointed!
- The year group auditions will be held on the morning of Tuesday the 23rd of February. All classes from Years 1 to 6 in the Hitherfield Virtual School and the Key Worker School will spend this morning watching the acts that have been uploaded to the Year Group blog. This will mean that no other activities will be posted that morning for these classes. Recommendations for additional activities will be given by teachers as usual on the 'pinned' section if you would like to access more learning content.
- After watching all of the acts, the teachers will also be sending the children a link to a survey. The children will use this to vote for one act that they would like to represent their year group in the Hitherfield's Got Talent Final 2021. Each class will have a representative in the final. It's very important that the children understand that they can only vote for ONE act in the year group!
- The successful acts for each class will be announced by the teachers on Thursday morning in their morning message.
- The Hitherfield's Got Talent show will be recorded on Thursday the 25th of February. A link to this film will be sent to all families on Friday the 26th of February so that families can watch it at a time that suits them

As usual, judges will comment on the acts and at the end of the show a winning act and two runners up will be chosen for each phase. Awards will be given when the children return to school!

So, children at Hitherfield...if you've got a skill or talent you want to show us, why not spend the half term shaping up your act and make a film of it? **Don't forget**...**all films will have to be uploaded by the afternoon on Monday when we return to school.**


