For the last term of the year, we have a new and exciting topic theme of migration. Here, children will learn what migration is and how Britain and the world has been and continues to be shaped by it.

At a glance, it will look like this:

Reception: Celebrating the diversity of physical differences found in the classroom.

Year 1: Celebrating family identity and the many forms in which it comes to include family histories.

Year 2: Researching the local area looking at the rich and positive influence of migration on our high streets.

Year 3: Exploring emigration and identifying this as an important part of British and global identity.

Year 4: Learning about British Empire and the Commonwealth looking at its influence on patterns of migration.

Year 5: Exploring why people migrate to Britain to include forced migration and migration through choice.

Year 6: Examining the history of human migration and developing an understanding of how migration has always been part of the human story.

How you can get involved

We love to get the wider Hitherfield community involved in everything we do and especially in our new migration unit. Here are some ways you could get involved:

- Would you like to share a hair care routine? This could include sharing the ancient tradition of cornrows and giving a demonstration.
