1. Fun science activities to try at home

Cornflour Slime

Mix cornflour and water until you have a slime consistency. Try punching the slime – it instantly turns solid. Roll some slime into a ball in your hand and then stop – it turns back into a liquid.

Chasing Germs Away

when we wash our hands.

Place some milk in a shallow dish. Add some glitter or pepper. Dip a cotton bud into some soap (or children can dip their finger into the soap).

Place the cotton bud or finger with the soap on into the middle of the bowl. The

glitter/pepper will disperse and move to the edge of the

bowl. Children can learn about the cleaning power of soap as they chase germs away. This experiment demonstrates how soap picks up dirt from our skin and scares away germs

Salt Script

You will need some dark-coloured paper or material for this activity. Dissolve a few teaspoons

of table salt into a cup of water and use this as paint to make patterns on your paper. Leave

to dry in the sun and you will see beautiful salt trails where the water has been. The more salt you dissolve, the more effective this will be.
